Dear Leader Reid:

On behalf of the Water Resources Coalition, we would like to request Senate consideration of S. 2728, the Twenty-First Century Water Commission Act of 2008 when the Senate returns in mid-November for the wrap-up of the 110th Congress. We believe that it is timely and important to examine the nation's future water needs and develop recommendations for a comprehensive water strategy.

The Water Resources Coalition is a coalition of organizations representing state and local government, engineering and construction, ports, waterways, transportation services and conservation organizations that have an interest in comprehensive national water resources policy. Our primary focus is on the need to invest more money and resources in our nation's water resources which is why we have also been supportive of the Stimulus packages that have been under consideration in Congress.

It is critical that the nation prepare itself for continued population growth and the concomitant pressures on supplies that increased demands bring. In addition, weather variations such as extended droughts and climate change are bringing new challenges to planners and policymakers. We think it will be extremely useful for the Commission to analyze existing water assessments to examine how various federal agencies are dealing future water needs. We also applaud the legislation for requiring the Commission to develop a comprehensive water strategy directed at increasing water supplies and improving the availability, reliability and quality of freshwater. **It has been thirty five years since these issues were last reviewed by a National Water Commission.**

It is clear to us that federal investments in these goals will be key to improving our nation's economic prosperity and environment. While we are not yet in a crisis, we face chronic problems that will only get worse without planning and aggressive actions as showcased in the recent [PBS](#)


